ORNL FCU BRINGS FINANCIAL WELLNESS TO JA BIZTOWN

ORNL Federal Credit Union is proud to be part of Junior Achievement of East Tennessee's JA BizTown as the community's official credit union. Our new mini branch gives students an exciting opportunity to explore real-world financial concepts while managing a simulated economy.

Inside the cooperative, students can take on unique roles such as CEO, CFO, Marketing Manager, Loan Officer, Fraud Detective, and Thrive Guide. Through these hands-on experiences, they'll learn about borrowing money, protecting themselves from fraud and scams, and the five key functions of money: earn, save, spend, donate, and invest.

Adding to the branch's welcoming and creative environment, a custom mural created by local artist Gared Luquet of My Wild Murals will bring a unique piece of East Tennessee artistry into the space. The mural helps make the mini branch a place that feels connected to the local community while giving students an inspiring environment in which to learn and explore.

The new branch also brings ORNL FCU's ThrivePATH financial wellness program into JA BizTown, helping students build confidence with money through engaging, interactive activities. By investing in this experience, we're equipping the next generation with practical financial skills they'll use long after they leave BizTown.

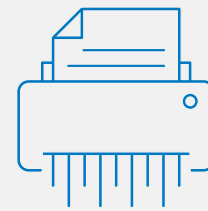

JEFFERSON CITY GROUNDBREAKING

BRANCH UPDATES ACROSS OUR REGION

ORNL FCU continued investing in its branch network throughout 2026, completing remodels and advancing new locations across the region—all focused on creating modern, convenient spaces that enhance the member experience.

NEW & REMODELED LOCATIONS UNDERWAY

- **Northshore:** Construction on the new Northshore branch began following a March groundbreaking. The existing branch will move operations next door into the new facility to provide additional space and modern amenities. Completion is expected by early 2027.
- **East Knoxville:** A comprehensive remodel began in June. Branch operations moved to a temporary location to allow for continued in-person service during construction. Completion is expected in early 2027.
- **Jefferson City:** ORNL FCU broke ground on its new Jefferson City branch in July, marking the Credit Union's expansion into a new community.

COMPLETED IN 2026

- **Madisonville:** Completed a comprehensive remodel in June, adding an improved layout, enhanced privacy, and upgraded technology.
- **Loudon:** Completed a full remodel in July, featuring updated interiors, enhanced privacy, and Live Teller technology.
- **LaFollette:** Completed a full remodel in September, adding an updated layout, enhanced privacy, and upgraded technology.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2027

ORNL FCU plans to continue its branch investment in 2027, with new locations planned for Maryville East, Seymour, Athens, and Dayton!

Together, these projects represent our continued commitment to thoughtful growth and investment in the communities we serve.

IMPOSTER FRAUD

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM IMPOSTERS



Scammers are pretending to be law enforcement, government agencies, businesses, financial institutions, family members, and potential romantic connections to steal your money or information. They establish contact through phone or video calls, text messages, emails, mail, and even computer pop-ups. Here are some key red flags to look out for if you're contacted:

- Urgency or encouraging you to act quickly
- Threatening language or implied negative consequences
- Requests for payments through services like Cash App, Venmo, or gift cards
- Promises that seem too good to be true
- Spelling or grammar mistakes
- Incorrect or unofficial email addresses

No matter who the person is claiming to be, it's best to trust your intuition. If you have doubts, simply hang up or cease communication and contact that agency, business, or person directly using information on their official website. Never click a link from an unverified source, and never send money to someone whose identity you haven't confirmed.
